MDOT and city of Ann Arbor to host first-ever HAWK Walk on Nov. 17

WHAT: The Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) and the city of Ann Arbor welcomes the public to celebrate an innovative new pedestrian signal soon to be active at the corner of I-94 Business Loop (Huron Drive) and Third/Chapin Street in downtown Ann Arbor. A HAWK, or High-intensity Activated crossWALK, signal is the first of its kind to be installed on a state trunkline in Michigan.

Following formal comments, state and city officials will join members of the community in a first-ever HAWK walk across the intersection to mark the installation of the new signal.

BACKGROUND: A HAWK signal provides a protected pedestrian crossing as a way to increase safety. A person wishing to cross the street pushes a button to activate the signal, which then goes through a series of yellow and red sequences, requiring motorists to stop for pedestrians. When the HAWK signal goes dark, motorists can continue through the intersection until it is activated again.
