Michigan Association of Municipal Attorneys Names Gregory T. Stremers

MAMA 2011 Distinguished Municipal Attorney

GRAND RAPIDS, Michigan – (Oct. 4, 2011) The Michigan Association of Municipal Attorneys (MAMA) has named Gregory T. Stremers as the recipient of its Distinguished Municipal Attorney Award for 2011. The award was presented during the annual MAMA Awards Luncheon on October 4, preceding the 2011 Michigan Municipal League Convention in Grand Rapids.

The Distinguished Municipal Attorney Award was established to honor municipal attorneys who have reached the highest level of professional accomplishment in the representation of cities or villages, and for their participation in and service to professional organizations such as the Michigan Association of Municipal Attorneys and the International Municipal Lawyers Association.

Stremers currently represents several municipal entities in St. Clair and Sanilac counties, including the cities of Sandusky, Croswell, Brown City and Marquette, the village of Emmett, and the townships of Lexington and Worth. He was nominated for the award by Brown City Manager Clinton K. Holmes, Croswell City Manager John Espinosa, and Marlette City Manager Lou LaPonsie.

During his 18 years of practice providing counsel for more than a dozen different municipal entities, Stremers has also served as a board member of the St. Clair County Bar Association and is a past board member of the State Bar of Michigan-Public Corporation Section. He is also a member of the American Bar Association-Local Government Section Committee.

As a community member, Stremers has served on the Port Huron Area School District Facility Study team and the Port Huron Charter Revision Commission, and has been the voluntary chair for various fundraising activities for the American Red Cross. He has also spearheaded free law clinics for those who cannot afford legal services.
